

Provincial Symposium on Defining the Interface between Medical Care Coordination for Children with Medical Complexity and the Ontario Special Needs Strategy (2015)

The objectives of the 3rd Annual PCMCH Provincial Symposium, held on February 26, 2015, were:

- To facilitate continued dialogue, shared learning and relationship building between representatives of the full continuum of care and service providers supporting children with medical complexity
- To enable focused discussion on the interface between the coordination of medical care for children with medical complexity and the coordinated community-based service planning capacity being developed through the Special Needs Strategy
- To support the continued collective advancement towards the shared vision for integrated care and service coordination endorsed at the 2014 symposium

The symposium was attended by over 130 participants from across the province and included representation from the following stakeholder groups:

- Representatives of the Ministries of Health and Long Term Care and Children and Youth Services

Provincial Symposium to discuss a Provincial Strategy for Integrated Care Coordination for Children with Medical Complexity (2014)

- Key enablers and recommended priority actions for advancing the strategy in 2014/15
