### “I am pregnant or breastfeeding. Should I get the COVID-19 Vaccine?”

#### Intended Use

This decision aid is intended for use by pregnant people or those breastfeeding who are considering getting the COVID-19 vaccine, as well as their healthcare providers, and their friends and family. This tool provides basic information only. It is not intended to provide or take the place of medical advice, diagnosis or treatment. This decision aid is intended to help in making an informed choice about whether or not to get the COVID-19 vaccine before, during or after pregnancy or breastfeeding. This decision aid has been modified from the decision aid produced by the Massachusetts Shared Decision Making: COVID-19 Vaccination in Pregnancy working group at the University of Massachusetts Medical School – Baystate Health.
