### “Je suis enceinte ou j’allaite. Dois-je recevoir le vaccin contre la COVID-19?”

#### Usage prévu

Ce document d’aide à la décision est destiné aux femmes enceintes ou à celles qui allaitent qui envisagent de se faire vacciner contre la COVID-19, ainsi qu’à leurs fournisseurs de soins de santé, à leurs amis et à leur famille. Cet outil fournit uniquement des informations de base. Il ne prétend pas fournir ou remplacer un avis d’ordre médical, un diagnostic ou un traitement. Cette aide à la décision a pour but d’aider à faire un choix éclairé de recevoir ou non le vaccin contre la COVID-19 avant, pendant ou après la grossesse ou l’allaitement.
